The Adnyamathanha Traditional Lands Association (ATLA) is the representative organisation of the Adnyamathanha people, who hold Native Title over the Flinders Ranges and surrounding areas. It is made up of over 20 different groups, representing more than 2500 people.

Our boundary

ATLA's boundary covers 41,085sq km in and around the Flinders Ranges.

What we do

ATLA is a self-sustaining organisation that has been working for Adnyamathanha people for over 18 years. The scope of the organisation includes:

- language and cultural preservation,
- strengthening the Adnyamathanha society,
- capacity building in the Adnyamathanha community,
- land management,
- environmental conservation,
- economic sustainability,
- service provision to Adnyamathanha people, and
- building strong communities and businesses.

Our achievements so far

- In 2012 ATLA partnered with Indigenous Business Australia to purchase the Wilpena Pound Resort. This partnership enables ALTA to provide traineeships and jobs in the region. Currently, 58% of the staff employed at the Resort are Aboriginal people.
- ATLA co-manages the Ikara-Flinders Ranges and Vulkathunha-Gammon Ranges National Parks, and is working with many organisations and lease holders to implement a Lake to Lake conservation corridor to protect the delicate arid ecosystems of the region.
- Adnyamathanha people manage large pastoral leases throughout the Flinders Ranges, including Mount Serle, Nantawarrina, Yapala, Myrtle Springs, Nepabunna and Leigh Creek Station.
- ATLA has negotiated mining agreements for their Country, providing benefits for not only Adnyamathanha but for people throughout the region.
